West Alexander Nov. 28.—Today at noon was solemnized the wedding ceremony of Mr. Robert Ralston Britt, of Lewistown, Pa., and Miss Harriett Carroll at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Ralph R. Roney, Mrs. Roney being a sister of Miss Carroll. About fifty guests were assembled at the appointed hour. Mrs. Barbara Underwood of Monongahela, an aunt of the bride sang "Oh Promise Me." This was followed by the strains of the Lohengrin wedding march played by Miss Maude Armstrong. Dr. H. M. Evaps, the officiating minister preceded the wedding party into the parlor. In advance of the bride and groom were little Miss Grace Carroll who held the bouquet of the bride and little Miss Helen Kate Carroll who bore the ring of the bride on a sprig of hyacinths. These children are the daughters of Dr. Charles Carroll, of Pittsburg, a brother of the bride. They were dressed in white and the sashes and hair ribbons were pink. During the ceremony Miss Armstrong played softly "The Sweetest Story Ever Told." The ring service was used. The bride's dress was white voile over messaline and she carried a shower bouquet of bride's roses and lillies of the valley. After the ceremony a four course dinner was served. The newly married couple left on the afternoon train for Monongahela where the groom is for the present engaged in the contracting business. As the bridal party took their departure they were showered with the rose petals with which the white bell shaped favors, that had been presented at the dinner were filled.
